

Excerpt: . . . Cologne is the dirtiest town in Germany, or in the world, probably; the same remark may well be applied to the inn--Rheinberg by name-where I lodge. Both are a disgrace to the Prussian Empire. I spent the forenoon in sauntering through the town. The Cathedral, if completed, would be the finest Gothic edifice in Europe. The bridge of boats here is only 455 paces in breadth; at Mayence it is 605. To-morrow morning I descend to Rotterdam. The climate is mild, dry, and delightful; very different from that of Munich and Frankfort; if it continue for a fortnight or three weeks, the vintage may yet come to something. Holland--The Hague, October . --Sailed from Cologne at seven A. M. on the 5th. Great crowd of passengers; as usual, the majority English. The day was showery, and the banks of the river were totally without...
